Dear Families and Staff of Sage International Schools,

Friday was [Holocaust Remembrance Day](#), the anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz - one of the most widely recognized symbols of the Nazi planned and led Holocaust of Jewish people and other vulnerable groups such as LGBTQ people, Sinti, Roma, priests, ministers, people with disabling conditions, and people considered to be enemies of the State (the Nazi Party). I ask each of you to take a moment to remember all of the victims of the Holocaust. If you are on our Boise campus, stop and look at our school's portrait of Anne Frank just inside the main entryway and consider her life and the lives of those swept away in this genocide. Antisemitism is alive and well in Boise, the United States and around the world. Similarly, hate crimes and violence inspired by hate towards vulnerable groups continues.

NATIONAL SCHOOL CHOICE WEEK

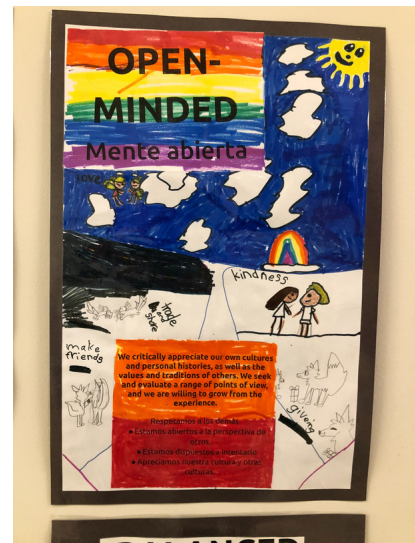
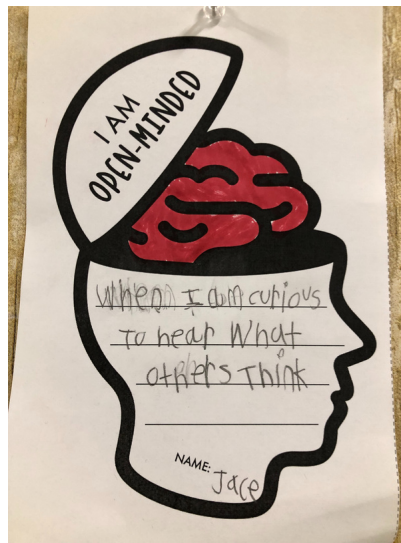
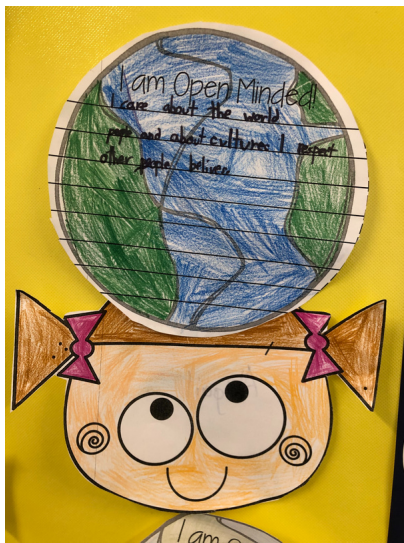

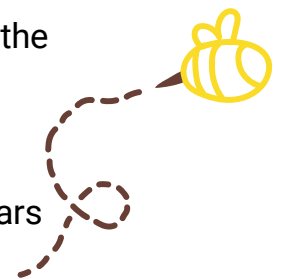
LIFE IN THE PYP WITH COORDINATOR NORA STRAUCH

We will be welcoming [Shakespeareience](#), a program of the Idaho Shakespeare Festival, to present the play *Much Ado About Nothing* to our MYP students on Thursday, February 9th. Ms. Lindsey has been preparing MYP students ahead of time for this opportunity.

Director Dakota Brown says: “Shakespeareience is one of the coolest programs I’ve ever had the pleasure of being a part of. I was lucky enough to go on the road with this tour for 8 years, and now I get to live my dream of directing a touring production of *Much Ado About Nothing*...my favorite Shakespearean Rom-Com. It’s got everything! A ton of hilarious insults? Yup. Masquerade ball? Check. It’s even got a wedding that goes horribly, horribly wrong, and a semi-secret “I was alive the whole time!” twist. On top of all that, this play features one of the best romantic lines in the canon, “I do love nothing in the world so well as you. Is not that strange?” Even 400 years ago, in Elizabethan England, folks were still saying “OMG HOW WEIRD I TOTALLY LIKE YOU.”

These characters—like us—are figuring out where they belong in society, gossiping behind each others’ backs, pranking their buds, lying about embarrassing stuff, getting their hearts broken, and trying to find eternal love.

Shakespeare was not only an incredible poet, but he was a genius at observing human behavior. If you look closely enough, you’ll notice that Shakespeare’s characters are all deeply, profoundly, human. In fact, some of them might remind you of folks you know!”
